1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Chair's objectives (article 2 of the Chair agreement) are:

A) To provide training on Global Health at the undergraduate and post graduate level to students, health professionals and representatives of NGO

- I. Undergraduate training on global health for medical students and NGOs staff was implemented in 5 different modules in the period April-June 2019;
- II. The Graduate Course in Global Health has taken place at the University of Brescia from February to May, 2019).
- III. The Master in Tropical Medicine and Global Health, co-organized by the Universities of Florence and Brescia, has delivered 60 credits in the Academic Year 2018-19
- IV. Undergraduate medical students from the University of Brescia have spent 1 month in Kampala (Uganda) at Mulago Hospital, upon agreement with Makerere University

B) To develop and expand collaborations in the field of global health with higher education Institutions from resource-limited countries

I. Collaborative actions in the field of global health have taken place with Kwame N'Krumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST, Kumasi, Ghana)

C) To promote operational research on HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria in Europe and highly endemic countries

The Chair has continued its research, with a specific focus on:

- I. Migration Medicine
- II. Health in developing countries
- III. Poverty-related diseases including TB, HIV/AIDS and malaria

D) To foster networking, capacity development and sharing of knowledge and good practices

- I. Promotion of the culture of Sustainability (SDGs UN 2030 Agenda) by completing the cycle of specific workshops, open to academic staff, students and the general population. The Chair has also contributed to the creation of the University Documentation and Research Centre for the Implementation of the 2030 UN Agenda
- II. The Chair ha co-organized, together with *Medecins sans Frontiers* Italy and *Medicus Mund Italy*, the Conference "Epidemie in regioni a clima tropicale. Strategie di

- prevenzione, attuali orizzonti nell'ambito delle vaccinazioni e strategie di controllo dell'epidemia", Brescia, 7th March 2019, addressed to medical students
- III. The Chairholder has presented in many national and international conferences on topics related to the Chair's mission

E) To closely cooperate with UNESCO

- I. Participation to the Interministerial Meeting on inclusion and mobility in higher education, held at UNESCO Headquarters, Paris 13th November 2019;
- II. Active participation at the meetings of the Italian UNESCO Chairs Group 1 (CONIUS: Cultural Identity, Immigration, Human rights and Health), including 11 UNESCO Chairs from different Italian Universities.
- III. The Chair has operated, together with other UNESCO Chairs to implement the project "Education and social work in Tanzania and Cambodia", in collaboration with Ruaha University, Iringa, Tanzania and St Paul Institute, Takeo, Cambodia

2. ACTIVITIES

Overview of activities undertaken by the chair during the reporting period, by objective (see Executive Summary)

A) TO PROVIDE TRAINING ON GLOBAL HEALTH AT THE UNDERGRADUATE AND POST GRADUATE LEVEL TO STUDENTS, HEALTH PROFESSIONALS AND REPRESENTATIVES OF NGO

I) TRAINING (SHORT TERM)(ONGOING ACTIVITY)

According to the approved plan of operation, the UNESCO Chair has organized a 10-hour elective course on "Tropical medicine and global health", addressed to undergraduate medical students and staff from the civil society (NGOs, etc.). The course took place in 5 distinct 2-hour lectures in the period April –June 2019. University credits (CFU: *crediti formativi universitari*) are offered to students attending 100% of the Course. The programme of the Course is attached (Annex 1). The Course is intended to be mandatory for students willing to participate in the stage at Makerere University, Kampala (Uganda, see below), that has an official agreement with University of Brescia to host 10-15 medical students/year willing to gain first-hand experience in the health systems in developing Countries

In 2019, 26 students attended the elective Course.

II) EDUCATION (LEADING TO CERTIFICATE)
(ONGOING ACTIVITY)

In 2019, the Chair has organized the XXIII edition of the **Graduate Course on Global Health**, coordinated by the Chairholder Prof. F. Castelli and by Prof. A. Matteelli. The Course is recognized as the **Core Course of the TropEd European Master in International Health** (www.troped.org). Many Professors from other Institutions belonging to the Tropd network and national and International Non-Governamental Organizations participated in the Course. A University certificate is issued at the end of the Course. The Program of the 2019 Course (February – May 2019) is attached (Annex 2).

In 2019, 15 students (physicians, nurse, pharmacists) attended the Course and were awarded the final Certificate

The Chair also organizes, together with the Universities of Florence and Brescia, the Italian Master in Tropical Medicine and Global Health, that delivers 60 credit to graduated students willing to gain experience and skills to work in co-operation activities in developing Countries.

IV) STAGE OF STUDENTS IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES (ONGOING ACTIVITY)

Upon agreement between the University of Brescia – UNESCO Chair and Makerere University, undergraduate medical students from the University of Brescia (4th, 5th and 6th year) have spent 1 month in Kampala (Uganda) at Mulago Hospital to gain first-hand insight on the health systems in resource-limited countries In 2019, 18 medical students participated to the programme

B) TO DEVELOP AND EXPAND COLLABORATIONS IN THE FIELD OF GLOBAL HEALTH WITH HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS FROM RESOURCE-LIMITED COUNTRIES

 Collaboration with Kwame N'Krumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST, Kumasi, Ghana) and HopeXChange Medical Centre (HXMC) On 26th October 2017 the University of Brescia (UniBS) and KNUST signed an MoU for developing and enhancing health research activities on Tropical Diseases, and more generally, on Medicine. The UNESCO Chair and the Department of Tropical and Infectious Diseases of the University of Brescia started operating in Kumasi since May 2016. In line with this initial MoU, all along 2018 and 2019, a research project about "Malaria and Gender" has been conducted by a UniBS PhD student

The implementation of the study has been accompanied by multiple visit by the senior academic staff of UniBS – UNESCO Chair, who also has provided formal and informal trained activities to local staff and students. The study results have been already presented at the annual meeting of the Italian UNESCO Chairs (Quaresima V. et al. Is *Plasmodium falciparum* malaria incidence and severity in holo-endemic areas affected by gender? Good Health, Quality Education, Sustainable Communities, Human Rights, Florence University Press, 2019, pag. 57-68) and are now submitted to and international peer-reviewed Journal (Infectious Diseases of Poverty).

- Care Evolution General Objective: To improve health conditions in the population of the Province of Inhambane (Mozambique). Specific Objective: To improve health coverage in the Districts of Morrumbene and Homoine (Province of Inhambane, Mozambique) through innovative practices, scientifically validated, with particular regard to HIV infection and children malnutrition.
- *Till the end* To improve access to detection and treatment of tuberculosis in the Province of Inhambane, Mozambique; To evaluate the effectiveness of using mobile Genexpert to detect active tuberculosis in a rural setting (Districts of Massinga, Funhalouro, Homoine e Morrumbene); To evaluate the prevalence of rifampicine resistence in a rural setting of the Province of Inhambane, Mozambique.

G) FUTURE PLANS AND DEVELOPMENT PROSPECTS

The present 2019 Report has been delayed by the Covid-19 Pandemic. It is to be remembered that the Chairholder Prof. Francesco CASTELLI is Professor of Infectious Diseases and Head of the Division of Infectious and Tropical Diseases of the Spedali Civili Hospital, affiliated with the University of Brescia. Prof. F. Castelli has acted as the Coordinator of the Covid response at the hospital level. The Province of Brescia has been among the first Italian Provinces hit by the pandemic in Europe, and without doubts among the most hitten by the fury of the epidemic with many thousands of affected people and deaths.

The activities that were planned at the end of the year 2019 are listed below with the final aim to fulfil the commitments taken under Article 2 of the Agreement with UNESCO:

- To continue the undergraduate training in Tropical Medicine and Global Health;
- To continue the post-graduate training in Tropical Medicine and Global Health, also providing scholarships for young physicians from resource-poor countries
- To continue the fellowship program for Medical students at Makerere University, Kampala, Uganda
- To organize the biannual Course on International Cooperation, together with other UNESCO Chairs in Brescia and Bergamo
- To finalize the training program on (i) migration, (ii) sustainable development goals and (iii) education to the benefit of the teachers of the UNESCO Schools of the Provinces of Brescia, Bergamo, Mantova and Cremona, together with other UUNESCO Chairs in Bergamo and Brescia
- To finalize the agreements with the newly created University in Xai Xai (Mozambique) to provide support to the Nursing School
- To effectively start collaborative activities with the Catholic University in Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)
- To strengthen collaborations with the UNESCO chairs in Lubljiana (Slovenia) and Tessaloniki (Greece) with the final aim to organize a summer school on "water related disasters"
